Dark-Eyed Junco

Small bird identified by black head and brownish-orange body with a white patch.





House Finch

Medium-sized bird typically found on trees. Striking red for males and greyish for females.





Mourning Dove

Light purple to grey bird with blue ring around eyes.





Chestnut-backed Chickadee

Extremely small bird with black & white head, brown body.





American Robin

Black exterior feathers with brown/orange belly. Can't miss.





California Scrub Jay

Blue feathers and white belly. Likes dry areas (e.g. foothills.) Not to be confused with Steller's Jays.





Northern Mockingbird

Relatively large body with grey body and beak. Remember: It's a sin to Kill a Mockingbird.





Acorn Woodpeckers

Black feathers, white body, and red cap. Frequently found with European Starlings.





White-Crowned Sparrows

Sparrows with a grey body, brown feathers, and a white and black head.





Western Bluebird

A symbol of good luck, this bird has a blue exterior feathers and white and brown body.
